STEPPING STONES

Provides critical basic needs and support services to families in need of emergency assistance.

1037 Clients

Empowers immigrants through education, citizenship services, and immigration assistance services.

Received immigration assistance services including: naturalization/citizenship; translation completion/filing adjustments of status; green card applications; family petitions; Violence Against Women Act assistance for victims of domestic violence; U-Visa applications for victims of crime in the U.S.; Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals and Visa applications.

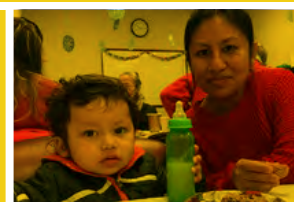


EARLY LEARNING CENTER

Provides full-day affordable, quality care and education for ages 6 weeks to 5 years old.

FAMILY ACHIEVEMENT PROGRAM

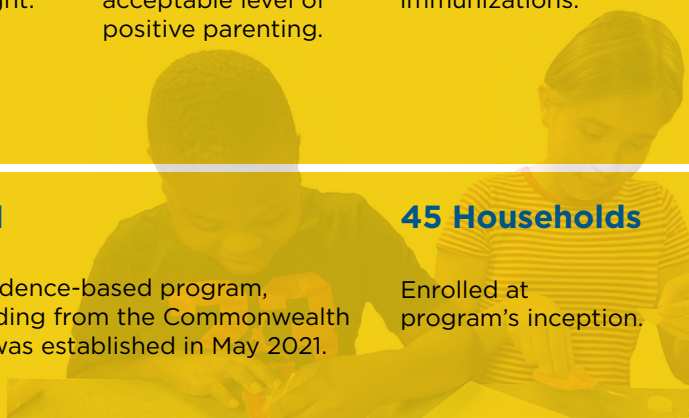
Assists families in achieving self-sufficiency and independence. Families work with a FAP coach to identify and achieve their personal, financial, educational, and professional goals.

This new evidence-based program, through funding from the Commonwealth of Virginia, was established in May 2021.

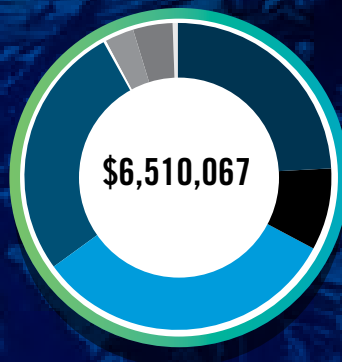

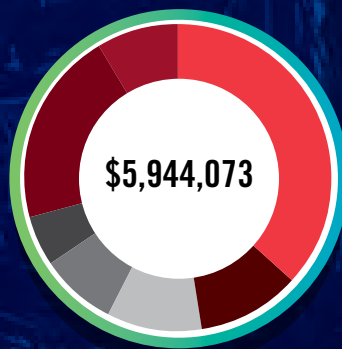
